

**NEVADA STATE BOARD OF
PHYSICAL THERAPY EXAMINERS
BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF**

MAY 17, 2007

- Item 1- Call to order / roll call to determine the presence of a quorum. After determining the presence of a quorum, the meeting was called to order at 9:04am. Board members in attendance: Pamela Hogan, PT, OCS, FSOM, Chairman; Jack Close, MA, PT, FAPTA, Secretary/Treasurer; Chad Bible, MSPT, GCS; Conee Spano, M.Ed., Ceferino Villafuerte, PT, MBA. Non-members in attendance: Allison Tresca, Executive Secretary; Richard Dreitzer, Deputy Attorney General and Lawrence P. Mooney, Chief Inspector.
- Item 2- Review and approval of minutes for Board meeting of March 22, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the minutes were approved.
- Item 3- Review and approval of executive session minutes for Board meeting of March 22, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Close and approved with a unanimous vote, the minutes were approved with a change to Item 13 to include the return to open session.
- Item 4- Review and approval of Treasurer's Report for period ending January 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 5- Review and approval of Profit and Loss Report for period ending January 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 6- Review and approval of Treasurer's Report for period ending February 2007. On motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 7- Review and approval of Profit and Loss Report for period ending February 2007. On motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 8- Review and approval of Treasurer's Report for period ending March 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.

- Item 9- Review and approval of Profit and Loss Report for period ending March 2007. On motion by Board member Hogan, seconded by Board member Spano and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 10- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of February 1, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 11- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of March 1, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 12- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of April 1, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 13- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of May 1, 2007. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 14- Review and approval of Fiscal Year Budget Report. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 15- Review and approval of Secretary's Report for May 17, 2007 Board meeting. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the report was approved.
- Item 16- Applicant Benjamin Buenaventura requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination for Physical Therapists a fourth time in accordance with NRS 640.100(4). On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Close and approved with a unanimous vote, the Board entered closed session. After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the applicant was granted permission to take the National Physical Therapy Examination a fourth time.
- Item 17- Applicant Devon Allgower requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's 5 year absence from the field. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the Board entered closed session. After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Villafuerte, seconded by Board member Spano and approved with a unanimous vote, the applicant will be granted a one-year probationary license after proof of completion of the Pediatric Primer course. The probationary license will provide that the licensee work under the on-site direct supervision of a Board approved therapist who will be on-site at

all times and co-sign the notes of the probationary licensee. An appearance before the Board will be required to request release from probation.

- Item 18- Licensee Jacalyn Levine Miklas requests release from probation. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Villafuerte and approved with a unanimous vote, the Board entered closed session. After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the licensee was granted release from probation.
- Item 19- Review and approval of report from the Deputy Attorney General regarding the use of technicians under Nevada Revised Statutes 640.310 and Nevada Administrative Code 640.595. The Board discussed the definitions of direct supervision and immediate supervision as provided in the Practice Act. Dr. Cracraft, PT and Joanne Gutschick, PT appeared on this item. There was a great deal of discussion on whether or not immediate supervision was intended to mean line-of-sight. Dr. Cracraft stated that by allowing unlicensed persons to treat, the Board was giving away the practice of physical therapy. Board member Close said that technicians are necessary to run a practice, especially financially because reimbursements are so low. The cost of operating a business must be considered. It was discussed that “immediate” means in control, but to what extent. Board member Close said the Board needs to continue to educate the licensees as to the difference between immediate vs. direct supervision. It was discussed that perhaps “immediate supervision” should be defined further as to how the Board interprets the current language. First step further define immediate vs. direct supervision. Next step may be to define what technicians can do. The Deputy Attorney General was advised to revise the opinion to further define the terms “immediate supervision” and “direct supervision”. The opinion should also include a reminder statement that assistants cannot supervise technicians.
- Item 20- Review and discussion of allowing College-Level Examination Program credits for inclusion in the educational evaluations from the Foreign Credentialing Commission on Physical Therapy. It was discussed that the Board rarely deals with the issue of CLEP courses and there appeared no reason to change the current policy of not accepting CLEP in the credentials evaluations. Based on information from other jurisdictions, they rarely have applicants submit CLEP for coursework. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the policy will not change.
- Item 21- Discussion and recommendation for the appointment of the Public Board Member to the Nevada State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners for the term expiring on October 31, 2007. It was discussed that this matter will be addressed at the July 19, 2007 meeting of the Board. The Board members will think about who may be interested and bring those names to the Board meeting for consideration.

- Item 22- Discussion of Nevada Administrative Code 640.630 regarding advertising and whether or not internet websites are considered advertising. On motion by Board member Spano, seconded by Board member Close and approved with a unanimous vote, internet websites are considered advertising, including any links to testimonials. However the website can contain a statement that the physical therapy office can be contacted to obtain testimonials. The Executive Secretary was directed to put this topic in the next newsletter.
- Item 23- Review and discussion of Physical Therapists using the term “doctor” and what is considered appropriate and legal in Nevada. Chairman Hogan commented that the Board has to consider what the general public thinks when their caregiver refers to himself as “doctor”. There is a concern that the patients will think they are being treated by a medical doctor. Board member Close requested the Executive Secretary to contact the APTA to obtain their stance on this issue and poll the jurisdictions as to any regulations they may have.
- Item 24- Review and discussion of adopting a list of what is considered the practice of physical therapy for use by the APTA when submitting courses. On motion by Board member Hogan, seconded by Board member Spano and approved with a unanimous vote, the Board accepted the definition of the practice of physical therapy as stated in the Model Practice act, with a few additions (see minutes filed for a complete list). Courses that will not be awarded continuing education units will include marketing, increasing receivables and setting up a practice, based on courses previously denied by the Board. The Executive Secretary was directed to send a letter to the APTA and provide a list of generally accepted courses, a list of previously denied courses, a list of previously accepted clinical courses and a list of previously accepted non-clinical courses. The lists are to be considered guidelines for the APTA to use when submitting courses and are not to be considered a guarantee of approval.
- Item 25- Complaint Hearings and/or Review and Approval of Consent Decrees.

Case #2006-38 / Julie Rains Biles, #2069. Board member Spano recused herself as she was the Investigative Board Member for this case. On motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the Consent Decree was approved.

Case #2006-39 / Cristi Yvette Cuellar, #1986. Board member Spano recused herself as she was the Investigative Board Member for this case. On motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the Consent Decree was approved.

Case #2007-05 / Marie Sharon Lumayag, #2010. Board member Close recused himself as he was the Investigative Board Member for this case. On

motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Hogan and approved with a unanimous vote, the Consent Decree was approved.

Item 26- Activities of the Board office.

- A) Update of activities of the Board office.
- B) Review and update of Employee Manual as it relates to mileage reimbursement for Executive Secretary when working outside of normal office hours. On motion by Board member Close, seconded by Board member Spano and approved with a unanimous vote, the Executive Secretary may be reimbursed for mileage to the Board office outside of normal working hours at the discretion of the Chairman or Secretary/Treasurer.
- C) Request from Executive Secretary to cash in a portion of accrued sick/personal time. On motion by Board member Bible, seconded by Board member Hogan, and with Board member Close in opposition, the Executive Secretary may cash in 8.5 days of sick time and 11.5 days of vacation time. This is a one-time request only.
- D) Update of Senate Bill 22. The Board was advised that the bill died because there was a misconception that a new fee was to be established for course review. The bill was actually a housekeeping matter to correct an error in the language by the Legislative Counsel Bureau when a change to the law was made during the previous legislative session.

Item 27- Update of annual routine inspections. Chief Inspector Lawrence “Pete” Mooney provided the Board with an update on the inspections. He reported that the audited included 452 individuals at 135 facilities. Due to therapists changing facilities, the inspections resulted in nearly 500 licensees being visited. The inspections resulted in a total of 13 field complaints. Please see the written report in the minutes file.

Item 28- Consideration of courses recommended by the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education at their meetings of February 8, 2007 and April 12, 2007.

The Committee recommended the following courses be approved through July 31, 2008 for the units listed. On motion by Board member, seconded by Board member Spano and approved with a unanimous vote, the courses were approved as indicated, except for Understanding and Managing Visual Deficits, which will be reviewed at the next meeting of the Board.
