



**NEVADA STATE BOARD OF  
PHYSICAL THERAPY EXAMINERS  
BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF  
NOVEMBER 19, 2009**

- Item 1- Call to order / roll call to determine the presence of a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 9:05am by Secretary/Treasurer Ceferino Villafuerte, PT, who is the senior Board member present. Board members in attendance: Ceferino Villafuerte, PT, Secretary/Treasurer; Michele Reuther, Public Member; Kathleen Sidener, PT; Emilio Puentedura, PT; Lisa Mukavitz, PT. Non-members in attendance: Allison Tresca, Executive Director; Lawrence Mooney, PT, Chief Inspector; Richard Dreitzer, Board Counsel.
- Item 2 - Pledge of Allegiance.
- Item 3 - Nomination and election for positions of Board Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer, Advisory Committee for Continuing Education liaison.

Motion to nominate Board member Villafuerte for Chairman: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Reuther.

Motion to nominate Board member Sidener for Chairman: Puentedura.  
Board member Sidener declined the nomination, stating that Board member Villafuerte is the senior Board member, having been on the Board for 5 years, and is deserving of the position. She also commented that she has been on the Board only one year. Board member Puentedura stated that Board member Villafuerte's term was expiring in 6 months and asked if it was appropriate for him to serve for such a short time. The Executive Director stated that there is no minimum time to serve in any position and also reported that Board member Villafuerte's term should actually expire in October 2010 as he replaced a Board member who resigned due to moving out of state. She also noted that she was advised by the Governor's office that the Board could make the request to extend the term. There was no second to this motion and therefore the motion died.

Vote on original motion passes with Board member Villafuerte abstaining.

The Executive Director advised the Board members that it is policy to have the Chairman and Vice Chairman at opposite ends of the state to ensure that someone with a leadership role is available for legislative issues, healthcare subcommittee meetings, etc. should the need arise.

Motion to nominate Board member Sidener for Vice Chairman: Reuther.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously, with Board member Sidener abstaining.

Motion to nominate Board member Reuther for Secretary/Treasurer: Sidener.

Second to motion: Villafuerte.

Motion to nominate Board member Mukavitz for Secretary/Treasurer:

Puentedura. The Executive Director advised that the Secretary/Treasurer must be in the Las Vegas area because their duties include meeting with the Executive Director to perform monthly bank reconciliations. The Board cannot pay an additional salary and travel expenses for a Secretary/Treasurer to come from the north each month and for emergencies. Motion dies.

Original motion passes unanimously with Board member Reuther abstaining.

Motion to nominate Board member Puentedura to Advisory Committee for Continuing Education: Puentedura.

Second to motion: Sidener.

Passes unanimously.

Motion to approve the minutes with grammatical changes and the addition of Board member Sidener as present at the meeting: Reuther.  
Second to motion: Sidener.  
Passes with members Reuther, Sidener and Villafuerte voting aye and members Puentedura and Mukavitz recusing themselves as they were not members at the last meeting.

Passes with members Reuther, Sidener and Villafuerte voting aye and members Puentedura and Mukavitz recusing themselves as they were not members at the last meeting.

Passes unanimously.

Motion to approve: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Reuther.  
Passes unanimously.
- Item 11- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of October 2009.  
Motion to approve: Reuther.  
Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.
- Item 12- Review and approval of Fiscal Year Budget Report.  
Motion to approve: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.
- Item 13- Review and approval of Executive Director's Report as of November 11, 2009.  
Motion to approve: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.
- Item 14- Applicant Ashley Brazil requests to the take the National Physical Therapy Examination for physical therapist's assistant's a fourth time in accordance with NRS 640.100(4).
- Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.  
Second to motion: Sidener.  
Passes unanimously.
- After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Puentedura:  
Grant request to take the NPTE a fourth time before March 2010; applicant

must provide evidence of passing score on practice examination prior to authorization of exam registration.

Amendment to motion by Sidener: detailed study plan to be submitted to the Board within 30 days to be reviewed by Board members Puentedura and Villafuerte. Amendment to motion accepted by Puentedura.

Amendment to motion by Villafuerte: a log of daily hours spent studying to be included in the study plan to ensure a dedicated amount of time. Amendment to motion accepted by Puentedura.

Second to motion and amended motions: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.

Item 15- Applicant Charles L. Jackson, Jr. requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination for physical therapist's assistant's a fifth time in accordance with NRS 640.100(4).

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Puentedura.  
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, motion by Board member Sidener: allow the applicant to take the NPTE for PTA a fifth time, with the stipulation that he provide documentation of on-line course he is currently taking as well as proof of attendance at any other courses; register for the examination no later than February 2010. Board member Mukavitz moved to amend the motion to include that the applicant must secure employment as a physical therapy technician. The Executive Director advised the Board that they cannot require applicants to work, but can suggest it to the applicants. Motion not amended.

Second to motion: Reuther.  
Passes unanimously.

Item 16- Applicant Marjorie Santos requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination a sixth time in accordance with NRS 640.100(4).

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener  
Second to motion: Mukavitz  
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, motion by Board member Sidener: grant approval to take NPTE a 6<sup>th</sup> time; applicant must register by February 2010; continue with study plan through Touro; submit to the Board a practice examination with a passing score. Once received, the Board will authorize the applicant's registration.  
Second to motion: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

Item 17- Applicant Zayin Grace F. Fitzgerald requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination a fifth time in accordance with NRS 640.100(4).

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener: grant approval to take the NPTE a 5<sup>th</sup> time; applicant must register by April 2010; submit to Board information and passing score/completion information from course applicant is voluntarily attending; submit to Board passing score on practice examination. Once received, the Board will authorize the applicant's registration.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

Item 18- Applicant David Lee Jacques requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's fingerprinting results. The Executive Director advised the Board that this is the second agenda in which this applicant has been noticed to appear and he has failed to show both times. The Executive Director advised the Board that the applicant will need to formally request an appearance before the Board before the matter will be placed on a subsequent agenda.

Item 19- Applicant Robin Jacobson requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to clarify the applicant's work experiences and absence from the physical therapy field.

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener: grant 1 year probationary license upon receipt of Board approved primary and secondary supervisors; must work full time in order for the probationary period to end at 1 year; annual continuing education requirement only, no additional requirement.

Second to motion: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

Item 20- Applicant Jill Neuenschwander requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to clarify the applicant's work experiences and absence from the physical therapy field.

Motion to enter closed session: Reuther.

Second to motion: Sidener.  
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener: upon receipt of Board approved primary and secondary supervisors, grant probationary license for 6 months; no continuing education above the annual renewal requirement and no appearance necessary to be released from probation. Board member Sidener commented that the applicant had been volunteering on 1-3 mission trips per year to perform wheelchair seating, treated wounds and assisted with gait-training. She also noted that the applicant had not worked in any facility for 16 years and the Board does not question her experience, but in the past 16 years, medications have changed, patients are not as healthy, documentation requirements have changed and this probationary period is to allow you time to get reacquainted with working in a facility on a variety of patients. This time will also allow you to have co-workers available to answer any questions you may have. Board member Villafuerte commented that the applicant will see how much has changed once she is back in a facility. The applicant stated that she would not immediately take a job where she was the sole practitioner for the reasons stated by the Board.

Second to motion: Villafuerte.

Motion by Board member Puentedura to grant full licensure stated that he believes the Board is being unfair to the applicant. He stated he is comfortable with her receiving full licensure.

Second to motion: Reuther.

The Executive Director advised the Board that this probationary period is to protect the public and the therapist, and follows the protocol established by the Board for applicants who have been out of the field. If full licensure was granted and a patient complaint was received, this Board would have to address possible legal action. Additionally, all applicants must be treated equally and in order to do that, policies must be followed to avoid appearing to show preferential treatment to any applicant. Richard Dreitzer also stated that policies are in place to protect the Board, protect the public and to provide for continuity. He further stated that the policies in place have been established based on history and consultation with legal counsel. He also advised that is not required for the Board follow policy but it is in their best interest to do so. The Executive Director added that the policies in place were created with the assistance of the Office of the Attorney General and the Board has, thus far, followed these policies and has had no lawsuits or complaints having followed these for the past several years.

Board member Puentedura withdraws the motion.

Board member Reuther withdraws the second to the motion.

A vote was taken on the initial motion, and it passes unanimously.

Item 21- Applicant Grzegorz Ros requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to clarify the applicant's work experiences and absence from practicing physical therapy since 2003.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.

Second to motion: Sidener.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, motion by Board member Sidener: upon receipt of Board approved primary and secondary supervisors, issue a 2 year probationary license; applicant must obtain 4.5 units of Board approved continuing education within 1 year of which 3.0 units must be obtained from on-site courses; must appear to request release from probation.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

Item 22- Applicant Barbara Lynn McClelland requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the results of the applicant's fingerprinting which revealed arrests not disclosed by the applicant on the licensure application.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.

Second to motion.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener, grant licensure to applicant under her new name, Barbara McElvain.

Second to motion: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

Item 23- Applicant Sharon L. Louthan requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's Arizona Physical Therapy license revocation, arrest record and the previously filed Nevada licensure application which was not completed.

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener, the Board will not take action on the applicant's request for licensure. The applicant is directed to contact the Indiana Physical Therapy Board and obtain information as to the details of the case and the outcome. Also, the applicant is to contact the Arizona Physical Therapy Board to obtain the details about the licensure revocation and whether or not their Board was aware the applicant could not go to counseling because of husband's health. The applicant must provide this to the Board in order to have her request for licensure considered.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.

Richard Dreitzer told the applicant she may wish to seek the services of an attorney to assist her in securing the information she needs.

Item 24- Licensee Richard Scott Derringer requests for an early release from probation.

Motion to enter closed session: Sidener.  
Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session, on motion by Board member Sidener: grant request to be released from probation as the licensee has met all of the requirements of the probationary license.

Board member Sidener congratulated the licensee and reminded him that his license does not allow him to work in home health.

Item 25- Complaint Hearings and/or Review and Consideration of Consent Decrees.

Case #2008-24 / Charlotte Janene Izatt. Board member Mukavitz disclosed that the licensee worked for her company before, but she does not know her, or ever met her, and can be impartial. Board member Sidener disclosed that she worked with the licensee previously will recuse herself from this item. Board member Reuther recused herself as she was the Investigative Board member for the case.

Richard Dreitzer advised the Board that the case dealt with a licensee who continued to treat patients, supervise technicians and bill for services, despite not renewing her license. He advised that he, the Executive Director and the Chief Inspector met with the licensee to discuss the details of the Consent Decree. The Board members reviewed the Consent Decree, which was signed by the applicant.

Motion to accept the consent decree as presented: Puentedura.  
Second to motion: Mukavitz.  
Passes with Board members Sidener and Reuther abstaining.

Item 26- Report from Board member Villafuerte regarding his attendance at the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy annual meeting. It was reported that the most interesting part of the event was a speaker who presented information on eliminating licensing boards and how that can save money, because other entities are covering what the boards do. He also noted that there was discussion regarding credentialing foreign-educated physical therapists as assistants. He noted there was nothing pressing to vote on.

Item 27- Update on annual inspections from Lawrence P. Mooney, Chief Inspector. A report was provided to the Board. Please refer to the minutes file for this report. Chief Inspector Mooney reported that the inspections were going well and most licensees welcomed his appearance. He reported that the majority of facilities in rural Nevada had been visited. He reported that the inspections for urban areas has been started and should be completed by May 2010.

Item 28- Discussion and possible action regarding licensees communicating with patients via text messaging. The Executive Director advised the Board that a patient contacted the Board office on this issue. The patient was not comfortable with her therapist's repeated requests that she text him as to her progress with her at-home exercises. She reported that she felt bullied to text him, but was concerned with her privacy and wanted her therapy on her time there and not feel required to text her therapist or have her therapist text her. The Executive Director advised the Board that she contacted the APTA as well as the other licensing Boards to gather information. The APTA has no policy on this subject at this time, but they are researching the issue. There are no jurisdictions that have any rules regarding this form of communication. She also noted that patient communication should be in the patient record and questioned if this was occurring. She also noted that cell phones are easy to misplace and was concerned with the security of the patient's information. Board member Mukavitz said she was concerned with potential HIPPA violations. Richard Dreitzer stated that if treatment pattern is not documented, that is when the Board may see complaints. Board member Mukavitz stated that if the messages could be secured in a manner in which they could be documented, that would be fine, but at this time that is not available as a standard feature on all cell phones. Board member Puentedura said that this could be an option for the patient, but it should never be mandatory. The Executive Director will monitor this item and report to the Board as warranted.

Item 29- Review and approval of white paper outlining definitions of "Clinical" and "Non-Clinical" physical therapy practice as submitted by the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education. The Executive Director stated that the Committee had revised the paper slightly, not changing the content, simply grammatical and formatting.

Motion to approve: Sidener.

Second to motion: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

Item 30- Activities of the Board office.

A) Update of activities of the Board office. The Executive Director provided a brief update, including that the continuing education audit was completed and the majority of licensees had taken approved courses. Of those audited that had not taken approved courses, the courses were submitted for review or the licensees obtained Board approved units in lieu of submitting. Board member Puentedura stated that some jurisdictions have a system

on-line which all allows for licensees to enter their continuing education and keep track of the courses they have taken. He stated that perhaps this Board could do that, which would allow the Board to easily obtain the course information from the site and possibly upload their course certificates. The Executive Director was directed to obtain information on this, including costs associated with such an on-line program. The Executive Director said she will report on this at the next meeting of the Board.

Item 31- Consideration of courses recommended by the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education at their meetings of October 6, 2009 and November 12, 2009.

Board member Villafuerte stated that his office submitted a continuing education courses with the intention of obtaining non-clinical units, but the course was granted clinical units. The course was review and it was determined that the units are to remain clinical.

Motion to approve the recommendations for approval and denial as listed for both meetings: Sidener.

Second to motion: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.
